# The Hamptons International Film Festival Open For Film Submissions

### Approved as an Academy Qualifying Festival for the Documentary Short Subject Award

The 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Hamptons International Film Festival takes place from October 6<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>, 2016

**February 22**<sup>nd</sup>, **2016**, **New York**, **NY**— The Hamptons International Film Festival (HIFF) today announced the opening of its annual film submission process. It also announced that it is now an Academy qualifying festival for the Documentary Short Subject Award.

With four competitive categories in narrative feature, documentary feature, narrative short film, documentary short film, and programs in seven non-competitive categories, the Hamptons International Film Festival seeks diverse films made by filmmakers that traverse the globe in order to tell their stories through different cultural styles and experiences.

Already an Academy qualifying festival for Short Live Action Films, the HIFF can now grant the winner of its Documentary Short Film Competition eligibility to enter the Documentary Short Subject category of the Academy Awards® without standard theatrical run. This is provided the film otherwise complies with the Academy rules which can be found at <a href="https://www.oscars.org/rules">www.oscars.org/rules</a>.

In 2015, three of this year's Oscar nominated short documentaries were screened at HIFF (CLAUDE LANZMANN: SPECTRES OF THE SHOAH, BODY TEAM 12, and LAST DAY OF FREEDOM). Last year also saw a record number of submissions for the festival, and 36 Oscar nominations from films that played throughout all categories.

"We are honored to now have two of our award categories recognized by the Academy," said Hamptons International Film Festival Program Director David Nugent. "Each year this festival grows, making it even more exciting to see the wealth of talent and art it attracts."
