THE HAMPTONS INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL SIXTH ANNUAL SummerDocs SERIES PREMIERES WITH LIFE ITSELF ON JUNE 21ST AND KEEP ON KEEPIN' ON, JULY 25TH

Series Presenter Alec Baldwin returns for conversations with Chaz Ebert for Life Itself and Al Hicks for Keep On Keepin' On

East Hampton, NY (May 21, 2014) – The Hamptons International Film Festival (HIFF) 6th Annual SummerDocs series is once again presenting East End audiences the best in documentary filmmaking. Director Steve James' (*Hoop Dreams*) LIFE ITSELF launches the series at Guild Hall in East Hampton on Saturday, June 21st at 8pm. Alec Baldwin will lead the conversation with Roger Ebert's widow Chaz Ebert. KEEP ON KEEPIN' ON screens on July 25th, also at Guild Hall at 7:30pm, with director Al Hicks in attendance for the conversation as well.

"Steve James' entertaining and inspiring story about Roger Ebert is a fascinating look at a film critic who truly helped to shape our culture," said series presenter Alec Baldwin. "AI Hicks' KEEP ON KEEPIN' ON is a moving portrait of not only Clark Terry's legacy, but of how one person's mentorship can make a difference."

"After another year in which a SummerDocs selection has gone on to win the Oscar for Best Documentary, we are excited to bring what we see as some of the most exciting voices in documentary films to the Hamptons," said Artistic Director David Nugent.

Acclaimed director Steve James (*Hoop Dreams, The Interrupters*) and Executive Producers Martin Scorsese (*The Departed, Raging Bull*) and Steven Zaillian (*Schindler's List, Moneyball*) present LIFE ITSELF, a documentary film that recounts the inspiring and entertaining life of world-renowned film critic and social commentator Roger Ebert – a story that is by turns personal, wistful, funny, painful, and transcendent. The film will be released by Magnolia Pictures on July 4th.

In his melodic debut KEEP ON KEEPIN' ON, Australian director Al Hicks spent four years following the charming and sometimes poignant mentorship between jazz-legend Clark Terry and blind piano prodigy Justin Kaulflin, during a pivotal moment in each of their lives. At eighty-nine years old, 'CT' has played alongside Duke Ellington and Count Basie; his pupils include Miles Davis and Quincy Jones, but his most unlikely friendship is with Justin, a 23-year-old with uncanny talent but debilitating nerves. As Justin prepares for a competition that could jumpstart his budding career, CT's failing health threatens his own. Beautifully nostalgic with a reverence for the importance of finding

your own sound, KEEP ON KEEPIN' ON celebrates an iconic musician while introducing one of equal vibrancy. It is a mentoring tale as inspirational as its subjects. The film is produced by seven time Academy Award® nominee Quincy Jones and Paula DuPre' Pesmen (producer of the Oscar winning THE COVE). The film was recently awarded two prizes at the Tribeca Film Festival - Best New Documentary Director (Al Hicks) and the Audience Award (Documentary). RADiUs-TWC film will be releasing the film.
