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Chinese Cinema Takes Center Stage at 22nd Hamptons International Film Festival

HIFF's Focus on Chinese Cinema Series presents five critically acclaimed films from China, the world's second largest film market, including films by internationally recognized director Zhang Yimou

October 7, 2014 (East Hampton, New York) – The Hampton's International Film Festival (HIFF) will place an unprecedented focus on Chinese cinema this year, presenting five films directed by critically acclaimed filmmakers – including one of the most influential Chinese directors **Zhang Yimou** (HERO, RAISE THE RED LANTERN)—along with discussion event featuring Academy Award®-winning actress **Hilary Swank**, renowned producer, screenwriter, and director **Joel Schumacher**, and **Daniel J. Victor** – producer of BLACK COAL, THIN ICE, one of the biggest art house hits in China.

Three of the films featured in the Focus on Chinese Cinema Series will make their U.S. premieres at the festival, including COMING HOME directed by **Zhang Yimou** and starring **Gong Li** (MEMOIRS OF GEISHA, MIAMI VICE), FANTASIA directed by Wang Chao, and RED AMNESIA directed by **Wang Xiaoshuai**. Making its New York debut, Director **Hu Wei** will present the short film BUTTER LAMP about a photographer that weaves through unique links among nomadic families creating a rich tapestry of the past, present and future. The 16-minute short drama THE WAY HOME, directed by **Ting Song**, follows the story of a man that struggles to care for his aging father who he locks inside a house and attempts to hide away.

China is the world's second largest film market with box office revenues of RMB 21.6 billion (\$3.17 billion) in 2013, a 27% jump from 2012 according to the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA). Massive cinema growth in the country in recent years has helped boost box office sales: according to the MPAA, there are seven new cinemas opening in China each day. The country's box office receipts are expected to surpass that in the U.S. by 2018, according to IMAX CEO Richard Gelfond.

On Friday, October 10th at 3:30pm, HIFF will present the U.S. premiere of COMING HOME – a story about a man who struggles to adjust to the changes after returning home from being imprisoned during the Cultural Revolution. The premiere will be followed by a special panel on the changing cinematic climate in China with Academy Award®-nominated writer/producer James Schamus, Jeff Sharp, President/CEO of Story Mining & Supply Co., and moderator La Frances Hui, curator at Asia Society New York. The Focus on Chinese Cinema Brunch will honor Academy Award®-winning actress Hilary Swank and renowned producer, screenwriter, and director Joel Schumacher on Saturday, October 11th at 1:00pm in East Hampton. The brunch will include a 30-minute business panel moderated by Jonathan Landreth (Editor of ChinaFile) with guests Jeff Sharp and Daniel J. Victor – producer of BLACK COAL, THIN ICE one of the biggest art house hits in China.

The extensive focus on Chinese films this year was arranged with the support of the China Consulate of New York and aims to highlight the best in contemporary mainland cinema. The history of Chinese cinema is deep and diverse as the country itself, from the glorious silent melodramas to the visually exquisite films of Fifth Generation filmmakers to today's crop of big-budget spectacles and provocative independent films.

After years of imprisonment during the Cultural Revolution, Lu returns home to his loving wife Feng to find that she is suffering from amnesia and no longer recognizes him. About RED AMNESIA

Master filmmaker Wang Xiaoshuai (BEIJING BICYCLE) thrusts us deep into contemporary China with a powerful generational portrait of one family's struggle to reconcile their past, present, and everchanging future. Deng, a retired widow, attempts to connect with her two grown sons despite their lack of interest and dismissal of her more traditional family dynamics. Life slowly erodes around her until mysterious, anonymous phone calls stir up the family's history and foreshadow a breaking point for all involved. Simultaneously subtle and edgy, RED AMNESIA is a scintillating thriller deftly exploring the personal and political.
