FROM THE FESTIVAL

Welcome to the 33rd annual Hamptons International Film Festival. For the second year, we are proud to present eleven days of world-class films across the East End, including anticipated new work from acclaimed masters and first features and shorts from emerging directors who represent the bright future of cinema.

The HamptonsFilm team has been busy this year, returning with a Winter Classic screening at Guild Hall, commemorating 25 years of celebrating emerging voices in our Screenwriters Lab, showcasing Melissa Mathison-winning screenplay in front of a live audience in New York City, and bringing films into our local schools via our HIFF Jr. initiatives. We just wrapped up a successful summer, with our 17th SummerDocs series, two sessions of Student Film Camp, and our very popular outdoor summer movie series—including a blockbuster 50th anniversary screening of JAWS on Main Beach, our largest one to date!

This year's festival marks a long-awaited return to Southampton, where we are proud to partner with the newly-revamped Southampton Playhouse, boasting state-of-the-art technology mixed with showstopping design. From there, we dive into ten more days of smart and entertaining features, including seven world premieres and more than 28 US and North American premieres—including many of the most celebrated films from Cannes, Sundance, Telluride and beyond. Our 57 short films include both our showcase of work from emerging female directors—through our partnership with NYWIFT—and a program by university students from around the world. Through our signature programs, we address issues of animal rights, global conflict, and climate change, and highlight new works by local filmmakers and films shot here on Long Island.

Our 2025 honorees include Sydney Sweeney, whose electrifying performance in our Centerpiece film CHRISTY is sure to captivate. We are also excited to welcome legendary actor Ethan Hawke, who will take part in a Conversation With while here with his new film BLUE MOON. We also celebrate UBS Breakthrough Director Eva Victor, who stunned Sundance earlier this year with their film SORRY, BABY, and UBS Breakthrough Performer Tonatiuh's performance in KISS OF THE SPIDER WOMAN announces the arrival of a major new talent.

We want to recognize our dedicated board members for their many contributions and especially thank board member Regina K. 

TICKET LIMITS

During individual ticket sales to the public (beginning on 9/22), a customer is limited to four tickets to any one film or presentation.

POLICIES

The festival maintains a zero tolerance policy regarding bigotry, hate, discrimination, bullying, or harassment of any kind. We are committed to providing an environment that is free from discrimination and harassment where staff and quests are treated with dignity, courtesy and respect. If you are found in violation of this policy you will be asked to leave and not return. You will not be issued a refund.

SEATING

To quarantee admission. attendees must be present in line at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. Seats are general admission, and tickets are subject to availability. Saving space in line or seats within the theater is not permitted. Late seating is at the discretion of the venue management.

TICKET DISCOUNTS

HIFF offers a 20% senior discount (65+) for Spotlight and General Films ONLY. Discounted admissions are only available at the Box Office with valid ID. Discounts must be applied at the point of purchase. Refunds will not be applied retroactively. Discounts can not be stacked

TICKET SURCHARGES

Tickets purchased online or by phone are subject to a 15% per item surcharge. Tickets purchased at any HIFF Box Office are subject to a 20% per item surcharge. Print at home delivery option is available for no additional charge. All pass and packages are subject to a fulfillment surcharge per item.

All sales are final. No refunds or exchanges are given, regardless of weather, traffic, or other unexpected circumstances, except in the case of program cancellations or Federal, State or Local government shutdowns or mass gathering restrictions.

Vija Celmins (pictured, left) has long been admired for her meticulous renderings of natural imagery, including ocean waves, desert floors, and night skies. Her paintings, sculptures, drawings, and prints depict scenes that are too vast or mercurial to be fixed in the mind's eye. Her work has been featured in major institutions including MoMA, the Whitney, and the Centre Pompidou, and has had more than 40 solo exhibitions and retrospectives, and her awards include a Guggenheim Fellowship, a MacArthur Fellowship, and the Carnegie Prize. Vija is currently the subject of a comprehensive solo exhibition featuring a selection of her paintings, drawings, and sculptures spanning from the 1960s to the present day, at the Fondation Beyeler in Basel, Switzerland.

"Vija Celmins is a celebrated visual artist known for her intricate drawings of oceans, stars, and desert landscapes. Her minimal, contemplative yet daring work mirrors the spirit of the films we champion at HIFF and reflects the natural beauty of the Hamptons. Having been inspired by Vija's art for many many years, I am deeply proud and grateful to her for sharing her extraordinary work with us as the 2025 HIFF poster artist," said Toni Ross, local East End artist and HIFF co-founder and founding Chairman of the Board.











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MERRILY WE ROLL ALONG








ETHAN HAWKE

Ethan Hawke has long stood among cinema's most distinctive and quietly brilliant actors. In BLUE MOON, his ninth collaboration with Richard Linklater, he delivers a career-defining performance as Lorenz Hart—magnetic, emotionally raw, and deeply human.

Over nearly four decades, Hawke has continually reshaped his screen identity in acclaimed work like TRAINING DAY, BOYHOOD, the BEFORE trilogy, and FIRST REFORMED, for which he earned both Gotham and Independent Spirit Awards, plus over 30 critics prizes—including the rare trifecta of Best Actor honors from the New York Film Critics Circle, Los Angeles Film Critics Association, and National Society of Film Critics. His blazing turn as abolitionist "John Brown" in *The Good Lord Bird* earned Hawke a Peabody, a Gotham Award, and nominations from SAG, the Golden Globes, and TCA. Next, he stars in Sterlin Harjo's FX drama *The Lowdown*.

Across every genre and format, Hawke remains a fearless, ever-evolving screen artist.

Olsen's television credits include *Love and Death*, for which she received a Golden Globe nomination; *WandaVision*, for which she received Emmy®, Golden Globe and Critics Choice Award nominations; and *Sorry For Your Loss*. In addition, Olsen is a *New York Times* best-selling author with her children's book *Hattie Harmony: Worry Detective*.

Eva Victor (they/she) is a writer-director and actor whose fearless character-forward comedic sensibility has cemented them as an undeniable triple threat to watch.

Victor has boldly established themself as a singular emerging cinematic voice with their feature directorial debut SORRY, BABY, which world premiered to massive acclaim at the Sundance Film Festival. The film, which Victor also wrote and stars in alongside Naomi Ackie and Lucas Hedges, was produced by Barry Jenkins' PASTEL. Following its premiere, SORRY, BABY quickly became the breakout film of this year's festival, winning the Waldo Salt Screenwriting Award, with the jury praising its "stunning honesty [and] moving sense of humor." A24 acquired the rights to the film shortly after its premiere for a 2025 release.

Critics have lauded Victor as "an idiosyncratic and exciting new American artist," (*The Daily Beast*), "a breakaway talent" (*Esquire*) and "one of her generation's most insightful new voices" (*The Wrap*), among other praise.

Prior to SORRY, BABY, Victor cut her teeth in the comedy sphere, achieving significant success with myriad viral videos, which led The New York Times to deem them "a magnetic performer whose motormouth characters evoke the comic anxiety of Roz Chast cartoons." They have written for The New Yorker and Reductress, serving as an associate editor and staff writer at the latter, and made videos for Comedy Central. As an actor, Victor has appeared in several roles, most notably as Rian in the final three seasons of SHOWTIME's *Billions*.

Victor was born in Paris, France and is now based in Los Angeles, CA.

SUMMER FILM CAMP

We were thrilled to offer student Film Camps in the Hamptons for kids ages 8 to 18, continuing a signature HIFF Jr. initiative. Campers create their own short films while learning screenwriting, directing, acting, producing and editing from industry professionals. Film Camp provides a creative outlet and thorough introduction to filmmaking to help kids launch their own projects for fun, passion, and perhaps even a future career. DURING HIFF: UNITED NATIONS SHORT FILM PARTNERSHIP

HamptonsFilm is proud of our longstanding partnership with the United Nations Plural+ International Film Festival, allowing us to invite local students to view films made by global youth and engage in discussions around diversity, migration, inclusion and human rights. Since 2015, thousands of students have attended these screenings—followed by conversations with the filmmakers themselves—and continued to wrestle with these larger issues back in the classroom. These screenings amplify the voices of those around the world experiencing some of the same critical issues we face right here in the Hamptons.

IN-SCHOOL PROGRAMS

HIFF Jr. presents various screenings in local schools throughout the year. Programs in partnership with United Nations Plural+ (see above) address issues of global human rights. Our Compassion, Justice and Animal Rights program centers on the humane treatment of all living beings. The Neo-Political Cowgirls and HamptonsFilm partner on The Hero Project—an annual school residency for middle schoolers where film and theater meet to creatively help young people build empathy—and also offer free after-school filmmaking courses called Dude's Eye View and Girls' Gaze, which allow high school students to express themselves through the art of filmmaking.





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Your steadfast commitment to championing independent cinema, and cultivating creative talent, continues to leave a profound mark on both artists and audiences. In a world yearning for connection, this festival reminds us of the enduring power of stories—to inspire, to challenge, and to unite.
